Writing the Equation of a Line Given the Slope and the y -Intercept

• Example 1

(a) Write the equation of a line with slope 3 and y -intercept 5.

Using the slope-intercept form, we have

$$y = 3x + 5$$

which is the desired equation.

(b) Write the equation of a line with slope $-\frac{3}{4}$ and y -intercept -3 .

We obtain

$$y = -\frac{3}{4}x + (-3)$$

or

$$y = -\frac{3}{4}x - 3$$
